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**AGREED ORDER SEALING COURT RECORDS PURSUANT TO FLORIDA RULE OF  
JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATION 2.420 AND ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 06-36**

**THIS MATTER** is before the Court on the Stipulation of the Parties pursuant to Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.420 and Eleventh Judicial Circuit Administrative Order 06-36 for an agreed order sealing certain court records and the Court being advised and having reviewed the stipulation and agreement of the parties and finding that confidentiality of the information sought to be sealed jointly by the parties is required to protect the rights of the parties: to prevent a serious and imminent threat to the fair, impartial, and orderly administration of justice; to avoid substantial injury to innocent third parties; and to avoid substantial injury to a party by disclosure of matters protected by a common law or privacy right and the Court being otherwise fully advised of the premises, it is hereby:

**ORDERED and ADJUDGED:**

1. The Clerk of the Circuit Court is hereby directed to seal immediately the entire court case file and the progress docket. The progress docket shall not be available on any public information system and to keep such materials from public access.
2. It is further **ORDERED** that any material sealed pursuant to this Order shall be conditionally disclosed upon the entry of a further order by this Court finding that such opening is necessary for purposes of judicial or governmental accountability or First Amendment rights.

3. It is further **ORDERED** that the Clerk is hereby directed to post a copy of the attached Noticed of Entry of Order Authorizing Sealing and/or Redaction on the Clerk's and Court's websites for a period of fifteen (15) days and to affix a copy of the Order on the outside of the court record.
4. It is further **ORDERED** that the Clerk is hereby authorized to unseal any materials sealed pursuant to this Order for the purpose of filing, microfilming or imaging files, or transmitting a record to an appellate tribunal. The materials shall be resealed immediately upon completion of the filing.
